## **ABSTRACT:**

Everyone uses improvisation even if they don't realize it. This workshop will use basic improvisation as a way to enhance communication, build community, and improve problem solving skills. Three primary areas important to service-learning will be emphasized: (1) ice-breakers (finding commonalities with others); (2) role-playing (understanding someone else's journey) and (3) collaboration (creative problem-solving).
