PROMOTING DIVERSITY IN HIGHER EDUCATION: THE IMPACT OF COMMUNITY EDUCATION THROUGH A SERVICE-LEARNING APPROACH

ABSTRACT:

To foster harmony through diversity acceptance, our service-learning project paired college students with local children. 38 undergraduates taught 23 children various aspects of diversity, employing the learning-by-teaching principle. Assessments showed significant improvements in both groups' understanding of diversity. College students gained enhanced course comprehension and career insights, while children improved their ability to define and apply diversity concepts. The project demonstrated the effectiveness of early diversity education and its successful integration with educational skills.
